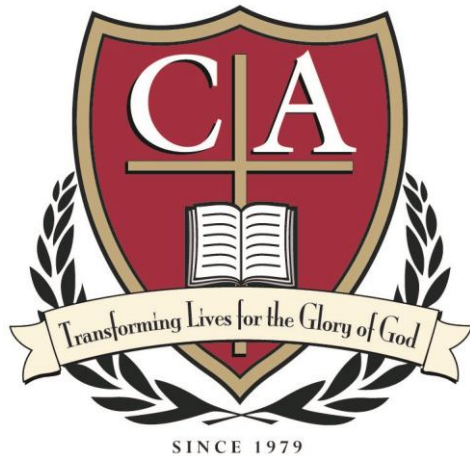

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## General Information

**Purpose:** California Crosspoint Academy's Summer Program is designed for students desiring to:

- Develop skills in core subject areas (enrichment)
- Earn high school course credit. If you attend a high school **other than CCA** you must check with your school to confirm acceptance of these course credits.

**Registration:** Class sizes are limited. Be sure to register as soon as possible. Complete the registration packet and return it to the school office along with your payment in full. After May 15th, a \$30 late registration fee will apply.

*\*Registration Packet includes: Registration Form, Emergency Information Form, Copy of latest Report Card/Progress Report (for non-CCA students).*

**Attendance/Discipline:** Consistent, regular attendance is required. **Parents must give serious consideration regarding vacation plans before enrolling their child(ren) in the summer session. For credit classes, no more than three absences are permitted in order to earn credit.** Also, students will be expected to maintain a high level of discipline and respect in all Summer School activities. Disruptive students will not be tolerated and may be dropped from the program.

### **Credit Classes\*:**

All six week courses may be for credit at CCA and possibly at other schools. It is the responsibility of the student to check with their own school.

**\*All CCA students must have summer school credit courses approved by the Academic Advisor.**

**Foodservice** will not be available. Students may bring lunch, snacks and beverages to be consumed during breaks and passing periods or as permitted by their teachers. A limited variety of food may be purchased from vending machines on campus. Microwaves are available for student use.

**Transportation** will not be available. Consider on-demand ride services specifically for students such as Zum. CCA will help arrange carpools if requested.

**Attire:** Dress should be neat and modest.

- Shorts, casual slacks or jeans are permitted.
- Collared shirt or colored T-shirts with non-offensive designs
- Clothing should fit comfortably (not too loose or too tight)
- Leggings or tights with short dresses or tops are not appropriate.

## **MS and HS Non-Credit Courses**

(4 week courses: June 21– July 21)

### **Session #1 Class Choices (8:20AM-10:20AM)**

#### **Middle School Math Workshop (4 weeks)**

This course is designed to strengthen and expand upon mathematics previously learned and prepare students for advanced mathematics. Students will be challenged to think about math from the perspective of “understanding math.” To understand math, they will hone skills that allow them to determine what the heart of the math problem is. They will learn how to analyze a problem, know what the problem really is, reason abstractly and quantitatively, critique assumptions, and connect their math problems to authentic examples. Fluency, practice, and precision of procedural math skills will be practiced.

#### **Freshmen Writing Workshop (4 weeks)**

This enrichment class is intended for students entering high school and will focus on the writing process and strategies in writing an effective essay. The class will reinforce the student's understanding of purpose and organization, developing an outline and thesis statement. Students will learn how to critique their own writing to create more effective essays. Expository and persuasive writings will be the focused modes of writing.

#### **Introduction to Mandarin (4 week)**

This course is designed for beginning Mandarin students. It is ideal for students who have never taken Mandarin and for those who would like to strengthen what they do know. Writing and grammar will be emphasized and Pinyin will be studied.

#### **Study Skills (4 weeks)**

This course will cover strategies and tips to help students comprehend difficult texts, take notes, prepare for tests, develop organizational skills, and manage time. A great course to prepare for the academic rigor of high school and college.

#### **Study Hall (4 weeks)**

Students will be supervised in a designated, quiet Study Hall room where they can do homework, study, work on upcoming projects.

### **Session #2 Class Choices (10:30AM-12:30PM)**

#### **Algebra 1 (4 weeks)**

This introductory course is intended for students taking Algebra I in the fall. The course will cover properties of real numbers, solving equations, inequalities and their graphs, exponents and polynomials.

#### **Geometry IA (4 weeks)**

This introductory course is intended for students taking Geometry in the fall. The course will cover properties between the relationship of angles and lines, as well as two column proofs.

#### **Middle School English Workshop (4 weeks)**

This course is designed for middle school students who want to strengthen their analytical skills in reading and writing. Classroom structures will support and encourage purposeful reading. This will allow students to develop their skills in inquiry, accountable talk, interpretation, and meaningful discussion leading to synthesis. Using their analysis, students can then transfer their thinking to written work. They will practice organizing their ideas logically and coherently in paragraphs and short essays.

#### **TOEFL Test Prep (4 weeks)**

Students will become familiar with the reading, listening, speaking, and writing skills measured on the exam. This class is intended for high school students only.

#### **SAT-Reasoning Test Prep – Writing and Math (4 weeks)**

Students will develop an understanding of the new writing portion of the SAT-I and enhance their skills in the areas tested and emphasized in the exam. This class is intended for high school students only.

#### **Study Hall (4 weeks)**

Students will be supervised in a designated, quiet Study Hall room where they can do homework, study, work on upcoming projects.

#### **Field Trip – TBD**

**Session #3 MS Enrichment Class Choices – (1:15PM-3:15PM)**

**June 21-June 30 (8 days)**

**Cooking**

Be a junior chef and learn foundational cooking skills and techniques in this fun 8-day course. Beyond boiling water, students will chop, peel, blend, and so much more. Of course, they will get to eat their accomplishments too!!

**Art Extravaganza**

Students will engage in multi-media platforms to imagine, discover, and create original projects! This course may include a variety of art forms such as drawing, painting, batik printing, craft making, graphic design, and much more!!

**July 3-20 (13 days)**

**Crime Scene Investigation (CSI)**

Students will find out how crimes are solved by collecting fingerprints and DNA, conducting fiber analysis, geospatial analysis and so much more!! This course is designed to develop laboratory skills and inductive reasoning.

**July 3-14 (9 days)**

**Filmmaking Workshop**

Adventure through the wonder of making a movie, beginning with a story and using technology to provide the different techniques of production and editing. You will need to bring any device that can take videos, such as smart phone, or camera.

**July 17-21 (4 days)**

**Outdoor Living**

There is nothing like the outdoors. This course will cover the basics of outdoor living such as setting up a tent, outdoor cooking, environmental friendliness, hiking, and backpacking.

## **Credit Courses**

(6 week courses – June 12-July 26)

### **Session #1 Class Choices (8:20AM-10:20AM)**

#### **Algebra IB (6 weeks)**

This class is intended for CCA students who struggled during the second semester of Algebra I and would like to make up the class or review the material that was taught.

#### **High School English (6 weeks)**

This class is for students who have a deficiency in fulfilling their high school English course requirements for graduation and college admissions. The course will be tailored to meet the needs of the students and will qualify under one of the school's UC-approved courses. Final approval from the Academics Advisor is needed to enroll. This course is intended for a student who has completed at least one year of high school.

#### **High School US Government (6 weeks)**

This class will fulfill the one-semester U.S. Government requirement for high school graduation. The course will provide an overview of the basic institutions of U.S. government and its constitutional underpinnings. This course is intended for students who have completed their junior year.

#### **High School US History A (6 weeks)**

This class will fulfill the first semester of the U.S. History course requirement for high school graduation. The course will provide a historical overview of American history from its founding to about the Civil War. This course is intended for students who have completed their sophomore year.

#### **High School World History A (6 weeks)**

This class will fulfill the first semester of the World History course requirement for high school graduation. It provides a survey of historical movements, trends, and events from Creation to the Reformation. This course is intended for students who have completed their freshman year.

#### **Study Hall (6 weeks)**

Students will be supervised in a designated, quiet Study Hall room where they can do homework, study, work on upcoming projects.

### **Session #2 Class Choices (10:30AM-12:30PM)**

#### **High School Economics (6 weeks)**

This class will fulfill the one-semester Economics course requirement for high school graduation. The course will provide an overview of basic economic and free market theories in the micro and macro settings. This course is intended for students who have completed their junior year.

#### **High School Geometry B (6 weeks)**

This class is intended for CCA students who did not do well during the second semester of Geometry and would like to make up the class or review the material that was taught.

#### **High School US History B (6 weeks)**

This class will fulfill the second semester of the U.S. History course requirement for high school graduation. The course will provide a historical overview of American history from about the Civil War to the present. This course is intended for students who have completed their sophomore year.

#### **High School World History B (6 weeks)**

This class will fulfill the second semester of the World History course requirement for high school graduation. Students will learn about historical events from the Reformation to the present. This course is intended for students who have completed their freshman year.

#### **Study Hall (6 weeks)**

Students will be supervised in a designated, quiet Study Hall room where they can do homework, study, work on upcoming projects.
